TELEGRAPHIST MISSING

Mr. Claude Mynott Believed to Have Died

Mr. W. Mynott, of 84, Milton-road, has received official notification that his son, Telegraphist Claude L. A. Mynott, R.N.V.W.R., is missing and believed to have died on war service.

Mr. Mynott, who was 24 years of age, was formerly employed at Pye's, and was called up as a Volunteer Reserve at the beginning of the war.

He was home on leave as recently as a fortnight ago.

In a letter to Mr. Mynott, the Commodore expresses sympathy with him in his sad loss, on behalf of the officers and men of the Royal Navy, "the high traditions of which your son has helped to maintain."
